



## Marie Judge

December 19, 1939 - April 6, 2020

Marie Judge was born in New Haven, Connecticut on December 19th, 1939, and passed away from bladder cancer on April 6th, 2020. She came from a family of nine children. Her mother emigrated from Germany at 14 years old (“without a lick of English,” as

Marie would say), and her paternal grandparents emigrated from Ireland. She is survived by her

four children and their spouses, Jenny and Philip Harris, Amy and Bo Martin, Kate and Patrick

Chen, and Robert and Brittney Woerheide. Marie also leaves behind six sisters, one brother, 16

grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. Her greatest sources of joy were her children, grandchildren, and her Catholic faith. In addition to raising her children, Marie worked as a secretary and later as a registered nurse. She worked as a med-surge floor nurse in California and a prison nurse in Virginia, before retiring in North Carolina.

Marie’s faith was central to her life. From her earliest days to the last moment of her life, she was a faithful daughter of the Catholic Church. She turned to God with childlike trust and

delighted in the tiniest details of His creation. Marie spent her final days in joyful anticipation of

meeting her Savior and His Blessed Mother.

Marie loved music and the English language. She was a devout fan of Bach and Mozart, vacillating in her opinion about which was the superior composer, until at last settling on the

former being slightly better than the latter. She loved all classical music, though, and could identify just about any piece she heard immediately and without error. Her high standards for

music extended to writing and the use of the English language as well. Marie was always happy

to provide feedback to her children as they developed as writers. She read voraciously, all things political and spiritual, and appreciated a well-written composition.

Marie's large family will always hold her in their hearts, cherishing the memories of her joyful participation in their lives. She will be remembered every time they gather together for lively conversation and laughter, every time they rejoice in each other's successes, every time they enjoy a good piece of writing or music, and every time they pray – hearing Marie proclaim in their memories "God is good!"

Marie's private funeral Mass will be held at Our Lady of Grace Catholic Church, in Greensboro, North Carolina. Following the Mass, she will be laid to rest at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Greensboro, North Carolina.
